

ENERGY MANAGEMENT CONSERVATION POLICY

As the School Board of the Londonderry School District, we believe it to be our responsibility to insure that every effort is made to conserve energy and natural resources while exercising sound financial management.

The implementation of this policy is the joint responsibility of the board members, administrators, teachers, students and support personnel, and its success is based on cooperation at all levels.

The District will maintain accurate records of energy consumption, the cost of energy and progress of the energy conservation program.

The principal will be accountable for energy management on his/her campus with energy audits being conducted and conservation program outlines being updated. Judicious use of the various energy systems of each campus will be the joint responsibility of the principal and head custodian to ensure that an efficient energy posture is maintained on a daily basis.

Seminar and curriculum presentations will be developed by Energy Education Inc. and the School District energy manager. This information will be made available to teachers who wish to use it in their classrooms to give students the opportunity to participate in the energy management program in the District as an “energy saver”.

Specific areas of emphasis include:

1. Every student and employee will be expected to contribute to energy efficiency in our district. Every person will be expected to be an “energy saver” as well as an “energy consumer.
2. Effective immediately, all unnecessary lighting in unoccupied areas will be turned off. All classroom lights will be turned off when students and teachers leave the room. Lobby and hallway lights will be dimmed after school hours unless there are evening activities scheduled. Custodians will turn on lights only in the areas in which they are working.
3. Energy management on his/her campus will be made a part of the principal’s annual evaluation.
4. The head custodian at each school will be responsible to see that each evening at the end of the last shift all lights in the facility are turned off, the heat is set to its’ maximum set back temperature, and all air conditioning is turned off.
5. Within sixty (60) days, administrative guidelines will be adopted that will be the “rules of the game” in implementing our energy program.
